The board members then recessed to be on call the entire day and to report back at 7:30 to receive returns from the precincts.


There were no absentee ballots issued and none returned and none counted.

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE CATAWBA COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS:

The Catawba County Board of Elections met on Thursday, February 9, 1984 at 11 oclock A. M. in the office of the Board of Elections to canvass the votes for the February 7, 1984 City of Conover Sewer Bond Referendum election. Members present were Albert M Yount, Lewis Waddell and Alex Williams. Each member coming at a different time.

The minutes of the previous meeting were dispensed with until next meeting due to lack of quorum. at same time.

The official results were recorded on the abstracts by Joyce Rudisill and Alex Williams and the official results from this canvass stand and are as follows:

After said returns had been canvassed by the Catawba County Board of Elections Albert M Yount introduced the following resolution which was read:

RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE CANVASS OF THE RETURNS OF THE SPECIAL BOND REFERENDUM HELD IN THE CITY OF CONOVER, ON FEBRUARY 7, 1984 UPON AN ORDER AUTHORIZING OF \$1,000,000 SANITARY SEWER BONDS AND DETERMINING THE RESULTS THEREOF

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Elections of Catawba County:

Section 1. The returns of the special bond referendum held in the City of Conover on February 7, 1984 upon the question of approving an order authorizing \$1,000,000 Sanitary Sewer Bonds of said City having been received from the proper election officers and having been canvassed, the Board has found and determined and does hereby declare:

(a) That each registrar and each judge for said referendum-were duly qualified by law and had taken the necessary oath.

(b) That the election officers incorporated in their returns the number of votes cast for and against the question submitted.

(c) That at said referendum there was submitted to the qualified voters of said City the following question:

Shall the order adopted on December 5, 1983, authorizing not exceeding \$1,000,000 Sanitary Sewer Bonds of the City of Conover, North Carolina for the purpose of providing funds, together with other available funds, for enlarging, extending and improving the sanitary sewer system of the City of Conover, both within and without the corporate limits, including, but not limited to, the enlargement of wastewater treatment facilities, the construction of sewer mains, outfalls and collection lines and appurtenant facilities, and the acquisition of any necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy of taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

(d) That no complaints have been made to this Board against the regularity of said referendum.

(e) That said referendum and the registration therefor were duly and properly held in accordance with law.

SECTION 2. The following schedule correctly shows the designation of the several precincts at which said referendum was held and, as to each precinct, the location of the voting place, the number of voters registered and qualified to vote, the number of votes cast in favor of the question submitted, the number of votes cast against said question and the totals of such numbers:

Section 3. From the canvass made, this Board does hereby determine and certify:

(a) That 2,346 voters were registered and qualified to vote.

(b) That at said referendum 192 votes were cast for the order adopted on December 5, 1984 authorizing not exceeding \$1,000,000 Sanitary Sewer Bonds of the City of Conover, North Carolina, for the purpose of providing funds, together with other available funds, for enlarging, extending and improving the sanitary sewer system of the City of Conover, both within and without the corporate limits, including, but not limited to, the enlargement of wastewater treatment facilities, the construction of sewer mains, outfalls and collection lines and appurtenant facilities, and the acquisition of any necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy of taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds, and 51 votes were cast against said order, and that a majority of the qualified voters of said City who voted thereon at said referendum voted in favor of said order.

Section 4. The Chairman of the County Board of Elections is hereby directed to transmit immediately a certified copy of this resolution to the City Council of the City of Conover.

Upon motion of Alex Williams, Jr , seconded by Lewis E Waddell, Jr-, the foregoing resolution was passed by the following vote:




The minutes of the past two meetings were read and it was unanimous that they were correct.

The minutes of the previous meeting were not read as no majority of members present at same time.


The purpose of this meeting was to review the budget for 84-85 and make some precinct officials appointment.

Other business taken up was the review of absentee applications and container envelopes.



It was unanimous by board members present to o.k. the 3rd and 4th assistant in Claremont precinct since the Registrar has requested the 3rd assistant.


