Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order. Larry Brewer reported that the office had received two grant possibilities from the state, one for equipment and early voting, and the other for early voting specifically. The Board will need the county to approve hiring a staff to run and new site in Mountain View every other year, as the grant will provide for the cost of such an early voting site except for personnel. After discussion, the Board agreed unanimously to order thirty (30) pieces of equipment for voting, plus necessary printers, storage racks or other equipment, plus two M-100 machines. The Board further agreed unanimously to operate an early voting site in Mountain View, if such a feasible site can be found, assuming the county is willing to fund the personnel to run such a site.

The Board agreed to designate 2 p.m. as the time to begin counting mail and absentee ballots on election day, and agreed to do all absentee ballot request meetings prior to the election to begin at 8:15 in the morning. Chairman Johnson then adjourned the meeting.

Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order. The Board began to canvass the results of the November 4, 2008 general election. First, the Board considered 530 provisional ballots. The Board unanimously disapproved 242 of those ballots on the grounds that the voter was not registered in Catawba County, approved 247 ballots in full, and approved 41 ballots to be partially counted for voters who voted outside of their respective precincts.

Larry Brewer reported that the state mandated simple counts of Precincts 35 and 38 showed no difference from election night totals. Brewer also reported that 4 early voters died before election day, based upon information obtained from the Register of Deeds office, but that the Board went ahead and counted the votes since no challenges were received to these voters pursuant to state law. Brewer further reported that 2 voters in Precinct 33 put their ballots into the automark machine inappropriately, but that those 2 ballots were retrieved and counted.

The Board then approved the results of the canvass and sent the official results, attached hereto, to the state.

The Board considered again a request from the Town of Brookford to have all of its voters vote in Precinct 4, even those who do not reside in that Precinct. The Board considered the fact that the voter tabulation district cannot be moved, so that moving a precinct line to accommodate this request would be administratively confusing and would not solve the ultimate problem. There will always be voters on one side of the line or the other who would prefer to vote in one voting location, but these requests cannot be accommodated in all elections and still be consistent with the voter tabulation districts required under federal law. The Board agreed to try to allow Brookford town residents to vote in Brookford town elections at the precinct location

of Precinct 4, at least for the foreseeable future until conditions change with regard to further annexation. Chairman Johnson then adjourned the meeting.
