There were no dogs in attendance, but there were plenty of dog lovers who came out on Tuesday evening to enjoy Tommy Tomlinson's unique blend of humor and imagination!

The audience enjoyed the background story to his latest book, subtitled "Passion, Glory and Lots of Slobber at the Westminster Dog Show." (Yep, this book gets up close and personal!)

Tommy told of his quest to find a AKC show-dog handler with the patience and interest in his mission to share the dog show experience

Spending three years on the road, Tomlinson went behind the scenes at more than one hundred competitions across the country, from Midwestern fairgrounds to Madison Square Garden. Along the way he was licked, sniffed, and rubbed up against by dogs of nearly every size, shape, and breed.

<u>Dogland</u> follows one champion show dog—a Samoyed named Striker—as well as his handler, Laura King, and **Striker's devoted entourage of** breeders and owners as he competes in the 2022 Westminster Dog Show.

Tomlinson's limitless curiosity about people and dogs reaches far beyond the show tents and into the ordinary lives of dogs. His book delves into many aspects of our association

with man's best friends, from experts who have discovered new insights into how dogs and humans formed their bond, (and how that bond has changed over the centuries), to the fascinating origins of different dog breeds. He discussed the elaborate breed standards that determine an ideal show dog and, of primary importance, the happiness of the dog at the shows and at home.




There were plenty of insightful questions from the audience and the program concluded

This is the story of Allison, who has a homework assignment to choose her favorite day of the week. What a challenge it is for her! Is it Friday, when she has pizza? Or Taco Tuesday? Maybe soccer practice and ice cream on Wednesday? Allison's solution is to name every day as her favorite—but for different reasons! For her ingenuity, Allison earns an A+. Each of the more

than 250 students in the 15 classrooms could relate to the challenge of choosing their favorite day of the week.



Special Request:

Did you know that the North Carolina Library Systems employ a lobbyist? That might strike you as odd, but legislators have many competing requests to be balanced and for libraries to have their particular issues addressed, their "voices" need to be heard. Lobbyists are those voices for their clients.

Grants that have supported various projects in the past are now unavailable due to cuts in federal funding. The Sherrills Ford-Terrell Library is requesting additional funding from FOSFTL to support lobbying efforts.

The board will vote on the 2025-2026 budget ahead of the annual June meeting, so please contact a board member with comments ASAP.


