

Activity # 2 – 5 Little Campfire Flames Stix Puppets and Chant for Kids

Materials to make the stick puppets: Brown, yellow, red, blue and orange Wikki Stix and 5 wood craft sticks per child.



Have the children use the Brown Wikki Stix to make pretend campfire logs. The brown, yellow, red, blue and orange Wikki Stix can be used to make the flames. In all, each child should make 5 Wikki Stix campfire stick puppets with the corresponding number of flames (see photo above.) Next practice the 5 Little Flames Chant with the children. Then have the children hold up the corresponding numbered Wikki Stix puppets as the numbers are introduced in the chant.

5 Little Flames (Chant to accompany Wikki Stix created Stick Puppets)

5 Little Flames in the campfire burning bright, The 1st one said, "Let's help make supper tonight!"

The 2nd one said, "I'm ready for hot dog roasting!"

The 3rd one said, "I'll do the marshmallow toasting!"

Activity # 3— Wikki Stix Campfire Craft


Materials needed: Brown, Red, Orange, Blue and Yellow Wikki Stix and any color of construction paper. Set the assorted colors of Wikki Stix out on the table or tray to invite the children to craft and play. If desired, pre-make one campfire for the children to help inspire their own creativity. The campfire crafts make great summertime displays at home, at camp, in childcare, in the class room.



Activity # 4—Wikki Stix Practical Life Skills

The following practical life activity will help children gain important skills and allow them to follow 5 simple step directions. Materials needed for the activity: a zippered cooler (to practice zipping and unzipping), an ice pack or ice, assorted Wikki Stix for creating various foods, a water bottle. Prior to doing the activity, brainstorm foods the children might like to take on a camping trip. Set out assorted Wikki Stix for the children to make any food desired. Go over the 5 steps several times, post the 5 steps as a visual aid for the children. Set all the necessary items out on the table or the floor then let the children practice packing and unpacking the cooler. This activity is a fun way to encourage the children to follow short directions and enhance life skills.

Following Directions – 5 Steps to pack a cooler:



1. Unzip the cooler and open the lid.



2. Put the food in the bottom of the cooler



3. Place the water bottle in the cooler.



4. Put the ice or ice pack in the cooler.



5. Close the lid and zip the cooler.






Camping with Tin Foil Recipes

You've made it to your backyard camping ground! Time to relax and fix a quick dinner with pasta you've already prepped in the kitchen. Everyone can personalize their own pasta packet and make it themselves.

Whole Wheat Pasta Packets with Tomatoes



Stir in any pasta sauce of your choice, salt, pepper, and olive oil with prepared pasta. Place a single serving of pasta in a foil packet with shredded parmesan cheese, basil and diced tomatoes. Heat packets directly over the fire until the pasta is warm and the cheese is melted, approximately 10 minutes.



Take campfire hot dogs to the next level with The Pioneer Woman's cheesy bacon, bun-free version. After slicing each sausage lengthwise and filling the slits with string cheese, wrap a slice of bacon around each hotdog and bunch it up in tinfoil. As the hotdog cooks above the campfire, the cheese will melt and the bacon will get crispy.



Campfire Cones

Trade ice cream for a warm cone full of melted candy. Fill a waffle cone with chocolate chips, mini marshmallows, chopped nuts, berries and assorted candies, then wrap the cones in tinfoil. Heat over the campfire until the chocolate is melted, then unwrap your dessert and enjoy. You can even top the warm cone with ice cream or whipped cream, if you're feeling extra indulgent.

Bittersweet Double Chocolate Coconut S'mores



12 marshmallows
12 oz bittersweet chocolate, cut into 3-oz pieces
whole chocolate graham crackers,
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup toasted coconut

DIRECTIONS

Heat grill to high. Place marshmallows on skewers or sticks, 3 to a stick, and hold over the grates of the grill until golden brown on all sides and melted in the center. Place chocolate on 4 of the graham crackers. On each graham cracker, sprinkle 1 tablespoon of the coconut over the chocolate and then place 3 of the toasted marshmallows on the coconut. Place the remaining graham crackers on top of the marshmallows and wrap each s'more in foil. Place each s'more on the grill for 2 to 3 minutes. Remove from the grill and serve immediately.

Tin Foil Fajitas



Create your own Tex-Mex flavourite. Make it Simple with Cheese or Pick your own protein Beef, Chicken, Fish or Veggie.

Ingredients:

1 pound boneless beef sirloin steak, cut in thin strips, or chicken, fish or ground beef
1 red pepper, thinly sliced lengthwise
1 green pepper, thinly sliced lengthwise
Yellow pepper, thinly sliced lengthwise
1 yellow onion, peeled & thinly sliced
1 package Fajita seasoning mix
1/3 cup of water
Flour or corn tortillas
Toppings: shredded lettuce, tomatoes, guacamole, sour cream, picante sauce, or cheese

1. Mix the beef, veggies, water and seasoning in a bowl.
2. Lay out 4 large, 20 x 18-inch pieces of foil. Spray or brush generously with oil.
3. Divide the mixture between the 4 pieces of foil.
4. Fold the foil over the food and seal the edges. Don't make the packets too tight because you need room for the air to circulate.
5. Grill the foil packets for 18 minutes. Rotate twice during cooking and make sure that the packets are at least 6 inches from the heat. Cook the meat to your desired tenderness.
6. Carefully open packets and serve contents in tortillas with toppings of your choice. Yum!

Campfire Quesadillas

Quesadillas can be made the same as fajitas depending on what filling you want. These quesadillas can easily be made using tinfoil. After cooking mushrooms, onions and bell peppers in tin foil on a hot coaled fire, create the quesadillas by placing tortillas down on large tinfoil squares, topping them with cheese and the sautéed vegetables or meat of your choice. Fold the tortilla half and seal the tinfoil packets for cooking.

Cheese Quesadillas

1. To build the quesadillas, spread one side the tortillas with a little softened butter and place buttered-side down on individual heavy-duty foil squares. Top with a mixture of the Cheddar and Monterey Jack. Fold in half and seal into individual foil parcels. Cook on a hot campfire grill until warmed through and the cheese is melted, 3 to 5 minutes.

Vegetable and Cheese Quesadillas

4 Tbsp butter, plus softened butter for buttering tortillas 1 (16-oz) box white mushrooms, sliced ,1 large onion, thinly sliced,1 red bell pepper, sliced, Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper,8 burrito-size flour tortillas,1 cup grated sharp Cheddar,1 cup grated Monterey Jack, ¼ cup jarred jalapeno slice

Burger 'n Fries Foil Packs



INGREDIENTS Cooking spray, for foil
1 lb. ground beef, 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce,
1 tsp. garlic powder, kosher salt, ground black
pepper ,1 lb. bag frozen fries,4 slices cheddar
cheese or cheese of choice, pickles, sliced
tomatoes

1. Heat grill to medium-high and spray 4 sheets of aluminum foil with cooking spray. In a large bowl, combine ground beef, Worcestershire, and garlic powder and season with salt and pepper. Form into four patties. 2. Place each patty on a sheet of aluminum foil with frozen fries. Fold up foil packs. Grill 10 minutes, then open foil packs and top patties with cheddar.

Cover grill to let melt, 2 minutes.3. Top burgers with pickles and tomatoes and drizzle with ketchup and mustard.

Breakfast Foil Packs



INGREDIENTS

6 large eggs, 1/2 c. milk, kosher Salt
Freshly ground black pepper
1 lb. refrigerated hash browns (thawed if frozen)
1 c. chopped ham
2 c. shredded Cheddar
Butter, for foil
Chopped fresh chives, for garnish

DIRECTIONS

1. For mixing purposes only; In a large resealable plastic bag, crack eggs, add milk, and season with salt and pepper. Stir in hash browns, ham, and cheese.
2. Butter four squares of aluminum foil and divide mixture pouring out of plastic bag among foil. Discard plastic bag Fold foil tightly and seal.
3. Place packets over campfire or grill and cook until eggs are cooked and hash browns tender and crispy, about 10 minutes.
4. Garnish with chives and serve.



Cinnamon Buns Foil Packs

INGREDIENTS

4 large oranges, 1 can (8 count) Pillsbury Cinnamon Rolls, A knife, fork and spoon, tin foil, Extra napkins... they may leave Your hands sticky

- DIRECTIONS**
1. Cut all of the oranges in half, and scoop out their insides with a spoon
 2. Stuff a cinnamon bun inside of each hollowed-out half: save the inside of orange for freshly squeezed OJ
 3. Wrap the orange & cinnamon buns individually with 2-3 layers of foil, and just set them in the fire for about 10-15 minutes. Remove from fire, add icing and enjoy!!
