

Friends of the Sherrills Ford-Terrell Library is overjoyed to report that the response to our event with Diane Chamberlain has been incredible! Tickets for the Tuesday evening event were snapped up in days. Ms. Chamberlain graciously agreed to provide a second program on Wednesday, May 18th, at 10:00 a.m. Priority registration has been offered to current FOSFTL members and any extra seats will be opened up to the general public. Online registration is through Eventbrite—see the link below; a waiting list will be maintained.

Diane will describe how she came to write this latest book, and will discuss various aspects of her journey as a writer. She will then engage in a Q&A with the audience.

Ms. Chamberlain has published 31 novels (so far!) and is on the best-seller lists of the New York Times, USA Today, and the Sunday Times. Her 31st novel, The Last House on the Street, was published on January 11, 2022.

What sounds dangerously modern after more than a century? Why, piano music by the likes of Kabalevsky and Scriabin, Shostakovich and Khachaturian, Ravel and Scharwenka!

All of those composers, and more well-known ones like Chopin and Brahms were featured in pianist Joyce O'Neal's fourth Sherrills Ford recital on April 11th.

Our ears have gotten somewhat used to "modern" harmonies, but pieces written a century or more ago can still sound "brand new." The works presented ranged from 1817 to 1930, with written and verbal explanations to make listeners comfortable. Joyce thanks the Friends for making these recitals possible.



Summer Learning Program Registration Begins May 16th


As in past years, the FOSFTL is sponsoring the 2022 Summer Learning Program. This year has an exciting mix of educational, live performances, and STEAM programs—with prizes! Activities for children, teens, and adults will include presentations by the North Carolina Aquarium, the Hickory Music Factory, the Green Bean Players, and Catawba County Parks.

The Summer Learning Program will feature prizes for registered participants based on their reading. Children will get interim awards at the 200, 400 and 600 minute marks to encourage summer-long participation.



In summary: thrillers and romance and history and gardening and home repair and —well, you name it! Hurry on in!

WHAT DO WE DO?

- **Support Library Programs** such as the *Summer Reading Program* for adults and children and *The Hickory Ballet* program
- **Provide Community Programs** throughout the year that offer broad learning opportunities for all ages. Examples include: author readings, the annual children's holiday party with Santa, a "Cook the Books" recipe tasting, the History of Sherrills Ford and Terrell presentation featuring local residents, CPR/AED training. We will also sponsor the Summer Reading Ice Cream Party for finalists and present Student Art Shows in the library showcases.
- **Facilitate Literacy Programs** at Sherrills Ford & Catawba Elementary where we read with 1st and 2nd grade classes.
- **Advocate for the Library** by offering support and resources to fill needs not covered by their budget. Recent examples include purchasing a large-format printer and a laminator for the local branch.
